

Determining Low-Income for Your Center

Buell Foundation uses the percentage of families served who have low incomes as a factor in determining grant funding. We define low-income thresholds by county below based on multipliers of the Federal Poverty Level. Multiplier amounts are informed by the self-sufficiency standard for each county.
